#### THE 13TH ANNUAL HALLOWEEN AND COSTUME SHOW BY JEFF WEHENKEL

I have the good fortune to have attended the national Halloween show every year for the past nine years. the reason that I attend is because I'm in the business as it were. Being vice president and sole designer for a company called GAG Studios, I spend the week in Chicago taking orders for my own line of frightful goodies, but as a Halloween nut and collector, I love

the opportunity to see all the goodies that I will eventually spend my paychecks on (much to my wife's chagrin). I don't know how many of you attend the annual fright fest that takes place every March in the windy city. I know several of you who do and are in the business as well. The show starts off calmly enough, just a huge empty Rosemont expocenter, the sound of construction, the smell of propane powered forklifts. But the opening day of the show I try to get in as early as the Rosemont rent-a-cops will allow, to get a look at the splendor. You know the sight of seeing Santa at the mall and the winter wonderland that they assemble for Christmas? Well, the Halloween show is like that to a certain extent, just when you thought you had seen it all, well you ain't seen nothin'. As usual Morris costumes and Rubies costumes have the biggest and most impressive setups. I love spending time at the Morris

booth talking cool stuff with Jim Lawrence. This year Morris didn't pursue the Batman license. Rubies costumes will be the only company doing masks or costumes based on the dynamic duo, needless to say, I'm disappointed. All the usual companies are there, Don Post, showing off their new line and all the new Star Wars props and masks, Including a "Greedo",

"Tie Pilot Helmet", and their full "Stormtrooper" figure. Distortions didn't have their usual big but too loud display, instead opting for a video demo of their most grand pieces. They did have an ID4 alien there and it was cool. Several new companies were featured in a darkened area upstairs, where companies were set up in a haunted house set-up. That seemed risky to me as a bad show could mean the difference between doing what you love or working at Burger King. I think Illusive Concepts had the best line of new items. Mario has been busy, they will have available a whole line of Kiss masks. Also they have gotten a license for the

Cryptkeeper, and those items look fantastic. Several new Star Wars props and maquettes, including a Darth Vader bust with removable helmet, to reveal Anniken Skywalker underneath. It was good to see Castle Blood set up their own booth, selling their incredible cos-

tumes. Anyone who isn't familiar with their line of Haunted House costuming should check it out. Little Spider has an incredible new line of props and animated items, and Boneyard productions is now putting out a Haunted House Newsletter called "Fright Times". All in all it turned out to bee a pretty good show for most of the dealers that I talked to (now I've got to fill all those orders!)



## A CHILLER EXPERSENCE

When the editors of HEADHUNTERS QUARTERLY asked me to be their official Chiller Theater Show correspondent. I thought it would be fun to write up a little article about the weekend con (held in New Jersey in mid April) and snap a few photos of the more interesting sights there. I expected to see and visit with allot of my friends and fellow collectors from around the world, and to end up having a great time and spending entirely too much money (as is the time-honored custom of collectors who are allowed to attend monster cons).

I sure wasn't prepared for what transpired there, as your official correspondent ended up feeling like a corpse- despondent.

Word that I was stricken with a sudden illness seemed to spread through the monster world at light-speed (as evidenced by the 43,000 phone messages on my machine when I finally returned home). Anyway, I wanted to take this opportunity to set the record straight.....especially since some people apparently think I'm dead! (Most distressing, of course, are those who have seen me since then but think so anyway).

Everything was fine and the Chiller show was, as always, just fabulous, up until around noon on Saturday, at which time I began to feel a little weak and dizzy. I I really didn't think at first that it was anything too serious, and I quietly went up to my hotel room to lie down. Well, to make a long story short—uh, slightly less long—I got progressively worse over the next couple of hours, and by the time the paramedics (yeah, that's right, there were two of 'em) arrived, they were unable to fond a pulse, although I was still wide awake and fully aware of what was going on. I was rushed by ambulance to the emergency room at nearby Meadowlands Hospital, where I was told that I was literally dying of internal bleeding.

It was Sunday night before they had me stabilized enough to repair what had turned out to be a bleeding ulcer right on a major artery in my stomach. I had no idea that I had any such problem, as there hadn't been any pain, even while I lay dying!

Luckily, although I came awfully close to checking out (and leaving the luggage in New Jersey), the doctors there were able to cauterizethe ulcer shut by means of a scope put down my throat (so at least I wasn't operated on, as such!). I spent five days in intensive care there in N.J. getting blood tests, transfusions, and other unpleasntries, but was finally released weak, tired, and pale even by my standards—the following Thursday. With that ulcer officially gone, I'm mostly okay again now (over a month later), but I hope I'll serve as a warning to all my fellow artists, writers, and business owners... TAKE IT EASY!!
Life is short!! Don't take on too much responsibility, and don't be afraid to ask your friends and customers to cut you a little slack if your feeling overworked!!

As I mentioned earlier, I had planned to take some photos of the Chiller show for this issue of HQ, but as it turned out, the only photos taken that weekend were those taken by endoscopy of the inside of my stomach (I would have gladly sent those in for publication, but I was afraid that maybe Chiller Theatre owned the Exclusive rights...).

I close this depressing tale with a big "THANK YOU!!" to the many monster fans (and/or monsters) who called or wrote to wish me well after hearing of my ordeal! It was a horrible experience to be sure, but it's really a great grate comfort to know that I have a loving wife, true friends that care about me, and a life-size figure of Bela Lugosi hanging upside-down from my dining room ceiling. Hope to see you all at the next Chiller Theatre show, and I promise to try not to hog so much attention next time.

I first learned of the show through the pages of such magazines as Model and toy collector and Kitbuilders, due to the fact that the main focus of the show is model kits. The photos these publications presented looked like so much fun that Jeff and I created our own model company and decided to participate. Four years later, here we are.

Now you mask collectors out there are probably saying to yourself, "Why is this guy telling me about a model show?" Well, over the years Wonderfest has grown into much more than just a model show. A walk through this years dealer, s room would have revealed not only the the latest in figure kits, but videos, magazines, toys, movie memorabilia and even masks and prop replicas. Dealers such as Just the Thing had the latest Don Post masks as well as some unique latex props that you wont find in your local costume shop. Luis de la Fuente of Grey Zon models was on hand selling his beautifully sculpted line of movie monster skull kits, as well as a line of bat gadget replicas to complete your utility belt. The Mental Mischief co. made their debut with their 1/1 scale gremlin bust as well as an impressive line of kits. Local effects artist Bill (Species) Weiger was present once again, displaying his work as well as some very impressive dinosaur sculptures. Also seen in attendance was a life sized MARS ATTACKS Martian direct from the movie molds and an actual Gremlin prop from GREMLINS 2.

McDoogal's House of Horrors unleashed HEADHUNTERS QUARTERLY on the unsuspecting convention goers as well as some of our display masks and our line of models and received a favorable response. We even had the pleasure of meeting several of our subscribers, including actor Daniel (CAVEGIRL, THE FUGITIVE) Roebuck. Dr. of Maskology David Lady and his lovely and talented wife Laura stopped by and sold some of their own creepy mask creations as well as an eclectic selection of masks from their own personal collection. We also had the pleasure of spending some time with talented sculptress Carol Hicks, look for an interview with her in an upcoming issue of HQ.

Each year Wonderfest plays host to some very special guests, and this past show was no exception. Acclaimed illustrator William Stout was one such guest. Mr. Stouts artwork covers a multitude of areas from his astonishing dinosaur illustrations to his design work on such films as CONAN, RETURN OF THE LIVING DEAD, and INVADERS FROM MARS. Also in attendance was Wonderfest regulars such as Academy Award winning special effects artist Chris (GREMLINS, THE FLY) Walas, and master prop and mask collector Bob (MAJOR MARS

The convention wrapped up Sunday night with the annual banquet, a tradition that is always a lot of fun.


