THE MAKING OF THE DEVIL'S WORKSHOP BY PETE INFELISE

I GUESS MY QUEST INTO THE WORLD OF MASK MAKING OFFICIALLY BEGAN IN 1994 WHEN I PURCHASED A COPY OF "HOW TO MAKE MASKS THE DEATH STUDIOS WAY". HAVING BEEN A YOUNG MASKAHOLIC AND AN ART MAJOR, IT ONLY SEEMED LOGICAL THAT I START CONTRIBUTING MY OWN PIECES TO THE WONDERFUL WORLD OF MASKS. HOWEVER, AFTER VIEWING THE TAPE I FIGURED IT WOULD BE EASIER TO CONTINUE BUYING MASKS AND LET SOME OTHER CRAZY FOOL MAKE THE DARNED THINGS. NOT THAT IT'S REALLY ALL THAT HARD TO MAKE MASKS, IT JUST REQUIRES A LOT OF TIME AND PATIENCE, NEITHER OF WHICH I HAD.

ABOUT A YEAR LATER, IN THE FALL OF 95' I ENROLLED IN A CERAMICS CLASS AT MY LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE. BEING A FINE ARTS MAJOR I HAD ALREADY TAKEN EVERY OTHER ART RELATED COURSE, SO I FIGURED WHY NOT? I FIT IN REALLY WELL, WHILE ALL THE OLD LADIES MADE THEIR POTS AND CUTE CLAY ANIMALS, I TURNED LUMPS OF CLAY INTO TWISTED SNARLING MONSTERS (I CALL THESE LADIES OLD BECAUSE I'M SURE THAT THE AVERAGE AGE OF MY CLASS MATES WAS AROUND 137!) I ALWAYS PICTURED MY PIECES IN LATEX, BUT AT THIS TIME I HAD NO IDEA WHERE TO OBTAIN THE SUPPLIES I NEEDED TO TURN THESE PIECES INTO MASKS, SO I HAD TO SETTLE FOR CERAMIC MONSTER BUSTS.


WELL IN JANUARY OF 1996 MY PRAYERS WERE ANSWERED. I HAD SENT FOR A CATALOG FROM THE MONSTER MAKERS IN CLEVELAND OHIO, AND LOW AND BEHOLD ALL OF THE THINGS I NEEDED WERE NOW AT MY FINGER TIPS! ARNOLD WAS VERY INSTRUMENTAL IN HELPING ME BEGIN MAKING MASKS, ALWAYS MORE THAN HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY OF MY QUESTIONS AND HELPING ME OVER COME MANY OF THE PROBLEMS I RAN INTO. THROUGH MY FIRST YEAR OF MAKING MASKS, I HAD BOTH MY SHARE OF SUCCESS STORIES AND DISASTERS. I GRADUATED FROM SCULPTING WITH X-ACTO KNIVES AND TOOTH PICKS TO "PROFESSIONAL" TOOLS, ALL THE WHILE WATCHING THE DEATH STUDIOS TAPE UNTIL IT WAS MEMORIZED AND STUDYING THE WORK OF MASTERS LIKE HENRY ALVAREZ AND JOHN SMITHTHESE MEN ARE SCULPTING GODS DON'T LET ANYONE TELL YOU DIFFERENT.

THE SUMMER OF "96 PROVIDED ME WITH MY NEXT BIG THRILL, MEETING MR. JEFF KEIM AT THE CHICAGO FANGO CON. AS TERRIBLE AS THE CONVENTION WAS, THE THRILL OF MEETING JEFF MORE THAN MADE UP FOR IT. UPON INTRODUCING MYSELF TO HIM I HAD ABOUT 379 QUESTIONS TO ASK, BUT IN ALL MY EXCITEMENT ONLY ABOUT 3 CAME OUT. IT WASN'T UNTIL EARLY IN '97 WHEN I SAW JEFF AGAIN, WHEN I HAD THE FORTUNE OF SHOWING HIM SOME OF MY WORK. IT WAS A DAY THAT WILL NOT BE SOON FORGOTTEN, THE KINDNESS, SUGGESTIONS AND ANSWERS THAT JEFF PROVIDED ME WITH WERE INVALUABLE. TO TOP OFF THIS WONDERFUL EXPERIENCE, JEFF INCLUDED ONE OF THE MASKS I SHOWED HIM IN THE 1997 DEATH STUDIOS CATALOG- MAN I WAS ON CLOUD 9.

A FEW SHORT MONTHS LATER AT THE RESIN HEADZ MODEL SHOW, I HAD THE FORTUNE OF MEETING A FEW MORE INSTRUMENTAL GHOULS. WHILE ADMIRING THE NEW LINE OF MASKS AT THE DEATH STUDIOS TABLE, I WAS INTRODUCED TO MR.DOUG GOINS, WHO HAS SINCE BECOME A GOOD FRIEND. DOUG HAS SHARED MORE OF HIS KNOWLEDGE WITH ME OVER THE PHONE AND IN PERSON THAN I CAN EVER REPAY. HE HAS SHOWN ME TONS OF TECHNIQUES, AND KINDNESS. THE RESIN HEDZ SHOW ALSO PROVIDED ME WITH THE EXPERIENCE OF MEETING HEADHUNTERS OWN JEFF WEHENKEL AND JIM KESSLER. I SPENT HOURS HANGING OUT IN FRONT OF THEIR TABLE AND CLUTTERING THEIR SPACE. IT WAS COOL TO FINALLY MEET A COUPLE OF GUYS WHO ALSO HAD A BURNING PASSION FOR THE WORLD OF MASKS. BOTH JIM AND JEFF WERE THE VICTIMS OF A BARRAGE OF QUESTIONS FROM ME, AND THEY BOTH WERE MORE THAN HAPPY TO ANSWER THEM ALL.

IT WAS SHORTLY AFTER THE RESIN HEDZ SHOW THAT I DECIDED TO START THE DEVILS WORKSHOP. I HAVE NEVER SEEN AN INDUSTRY SO FULL OF GREAT PEOPLE, SO WILLING TO TEACH AND TALK, I REMBER THINKING TO MYSELF,... SELF... YOU NEED TO BE ONE OF THESE GUYS, AND WITH THAT THOUGHT THE DEVILS WORKSHOP WAS BORN. IT HAS TAKEN THE BETTER PART OF THIS PAST SUMMER AND FALL TO GET THE BALL ROLLING. THE DEVILS WORKSHOP ITSELF IS ACTUALLY STILL IN IT'S INFANT STAGES, CONTAINED WITHIN A ONE ROOM STUDIO. ALL THE SCULPTING, MOLDING, CASTING AND PAINTING ARE HANDLED BY MYSELF. AS WELL AS ALL THE CATALOG PRODUCTION, ORDER FILLING, PAPER WORK AND ALL THAT B.S. EVEN THE DEVILS WORKSHOP PHONE LINE IS JUST A VOICE MAIL, BUT NOW THAT I'VE GOT THE BALL ROLLING, '98 PROMISES TO BE @N INSANE YEAR!



WHAT MADE ME BUT THAT? BY JOHN DENLET AKA PROF. NIGHTMARE

I've been collecting masks for over twenty years and I just started questioning my own tastes! Scanning the shelves of my collection, I would pause from piece to piece and say "what made me buy that"? The answers (too many to list) helped me form the following opinions about my own obsession, collecting masks!

- 1) If it's in the Dr. Lady book, I want it! That evil book isn't reference material, it's a catalog. Surely I can't be alone in this exhausting quest?
- 2) If it's NOT mass produced! The words "limited edition" should be illegal as they are just part of a secret code that sends signals to my wallet that say "John.... buy me Now".
- 3) If it's used in a film, it's essential! If the mask was used in a film or it's out of an original mold, I need one. It doesn't matter if it's some wimpy, obscure, monster [like TROG] If it's original, I want it!
- 4) Quality (this one is common sense) I want a thickly cast mask with no mold seams (foam filled even better) and beautifully painted. I don't wear my masks so if they can stand on their own, they get extra points!
- 5) The eyes have it! Sounds weird I know but if the eyes are cool or even glass, it has potential. I hate eye slits, They are like blondes with bad teeth (what a waste)!
- 6) Don't stop at the head! That's right, give me a cool neck or chest piece (matching hands don't hurt either) and it has more "monster for your money" appeal.
- 7) If it has a strong first impression! If I look at a mask for the first time and I say "WOW, that is awesome!" I will eventually buy it. Masks don't grow on me that would look silly!
- 8) If it's weird and offbeat! If I look at a mask and say, "Man.. I thought I was the only one in the world who even remembered that dumb monster", I'll buy it. Call this one lonely mask sympathy syndrome? What the hell, they need a home.
- 9) If it looks alive! So many masks are sculpted well but have little or no expression. There monsters for pete's sake, they are supposed to be pissed off....that's there job! Sure I know we have those sad misunderstood monsters but even Frankenstein's monster and Quasimodo eventually got even!
- 10) If it scared the crap out of me when I was a kid! I look at it this way, the monster mat have had the upper hand when I was a youth but now I own his damn head! He [or she] must obediently sit on my shelf or be traded to Jeff! Ha.. Ha.. Ha..

With these as guidelines, here are my favorites within my personal collection and the reasons why...

- 1) Ben Cooper Frankenstein (it was my first 29 years ago)
- 2) Barbara steel by Wayne Strong (this mask haunts me strong first impression, and those damn eyes!)
- 3) Elvira by Henry Alvarez (It's a dead on masterpiece)
- 4) Up side down head by Death Studios [Just plain weird, great eyes, unbelievable paint job]
- 5) Head bust from "Spookies" by Arnold Garguillo II [Built around a vacuum system, it actually decomposes before your eyes)
- 6) The Mummy (Christopher Lee) by Carol Hicks [Dead on likeness and thick, it could kick all my other masks asses)
- 7) Evil Pumpkin by Jeff Wehenkel (designed for use by a rock band, this mask just hits the mark)
- 8) The Man With The X-Ray Eyes by Pat Newman (very real looking)
- 9) The Geek by Ed French (silly, fun and disgusting)
- 10) The Predator by Distortions (sculpted by Henry Alvarez, this was the first and only mask that my wife bought for me. I was delighted, it's big, bad, and beautifully painted. It features a full neck and shoulders and most importantly, he looks mean! Mask makers take note.


